

Proposal Submission	Proposal submission for Coordination of Data Protection in the HBP

- This Call for Expression of Interest (CEoI) addresses the "Coordination of Data Protection in the HBP" Call Topic.
- The winning proposal will become part of the envisioned overall HBP Work Plan for the second Specific Grant Agreement (SGA2) period and will be located in the HBP Subproject "Ethics and Society" (SP12).
- Single organisations, either already part of the HBP Consortium or not, are eligible for funding under this CoEI. Proposals can only be submitted by organisations established in the EU Member States or Horizon 2020 associated countries¹.
- The parent organisation of the applicant that puts forward the winning proposal will become a full Partner in the HBP Consortium, subject to the HBP Framework Partnership Agreement (FPA) and will be required to sign the HBP Consortium Agreement. The addition of new Partners to the Consortium is subject to the approval of the required FPA amendment by the HBP Stakeholder Board and the EC.
- Funding for the Data Protection Task will be granted for a period of **24 months** (1 April 2018 to 31 March 2020). The planned budget is **EUR 318,750** (EU contribution, H2020 rules¹), including indirect costs equal to 25% of direct costs.
- The selected proposal will contribute to the development, improvement, maintenance,

and monitoring of the HBP's data protection provisions for the protection of data subjects. Also, the role of the data protection officer is expected to provide advice and guidance to data controllers and processors throughout the HBP, as well as to researchers and administrators within the project.

- Organisations/applicants submitting proposals for this call will be expected to have a strong track record in dealing with data protection in large neuroscience projects or equivalent.
- In particular, the selected proposals should, HBP-wide:
 - ensure the implementation of data protection measures for the protection of data subjects.
 - manage data protection compliance and advise on legal requirements and best practices (see General Data Protection Regulation, GDPR²), with regard to both European legislation and local regulation, where appropriate.
 - be a lead contact with data protection authorities, and/or national supervisory bodies, with regard to potential complaints and breaches, ensuring that requests for information are properly handled.
 - take on an audit role and provide monitoring data to the data controller on compliance and conformity.
 - develop and maintain the Data Protection Act Knowledge Base for HBP staff at every level.
 - co-ordinate Data Protection Act activities.
 - collaborate with relevant areas of the HBP, including neuroinformatics, medical informatics, and ethics management.
